Lanzhou, China Delegation Visits Albuquerque

Yang Zhiwu, Vice Mayor of Lanzhou Municipal People's Government led a delegation from our sister city Lanzhou to Albuquerque. On Friday, May 2 the Albuquerque Lodge of the Chinese American Citizens Alliance hosted a sit-down dinner in their honor at the Ho Lo Ma Restaurant. Since Mayor Chavez was out of town, he was represented by Albuquerque's CAO Dr. Perleman. Chris Chavez, the mayor's liaison from the city's Economic Department; Renie Ramona, mayor's Executive Assistant and her husband; Albuquerque security officials as well as some ASCF board members were also in attendance. On Saturday, May 3 there was a tree

planting ceremony at the Albuquerque Botanical Garden. Catherine Hubbard, Manager of the Botanic Garden, officially greeted the delegation upon their 4 pm arrival. She lead a brief tour of the gardens - the Ceremonial Garden where weddings take place; the two conservatories (Mediterranean plantings with the special orchid display and the desert plantings); Sasebo Japanese Garden; the Heritage Farm. Returning to the entrance, the delegation met Mayor Chavez. With special shovels, the "Tree Lilac" was planted. Mayor Chavez said that the tree was being planted to honor the special relationship between Lanzhou and Albuquerque. A plaque at the base of the tree reads: "Planted by Mr. Chen Baosheng, President Lanhou People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries; Mr. Yang Zhiwu, Vice Mayor of Lanzhou and Mr. Martin Chavez, Mayor of Albuquerque commemorating the Lanzhou Albuquerque Sister City Partnership." Mayor Chavez received a lovely gift of engraved gourds. Note: Although the tree lilac was purchased here, it also grows in China and has lovely white blossoms.

We had a few brief moments to speak with Mr. Yang Zhiwu, Vice Mayor of Lanzhou. He was sporting an Isotope cap stitched with his name (Mayor Chavez gave each delegation member one.) Mr. Yang Zhiwu has been Vice Mayor for 2 years. He speaks most glowingly of the 2,000 year old Lanzhou. He said that the climate in Lanzhou is similar to that of Albuquerque, having four seasons. Upon seeing the farm, he said that Lanzhou also had lots of apple trees. Carol Dawley enjoyed meeting Mr. Chen Baosheng again. There is a great photo of him on page 13 of the ASCF July 2006 newsletter.

The delegation's itinerary also included a tour of Cutter Aviation, a City of Albuquerque lunch and reception, an Isotope ball game and hot air balloon rides.

The Lanzhou visitors presented ASCF with a lovely gift - a wooden holder containing 2 handpainted discs, showing Dunhuang art - flying Apsaras. Apsaras were painted in the Mogao Grottoes during the Song Dynasty. This gift will be on display at the Convention Center.
