Castillo de Media Luna - Alburquerque Badajoz

Join us for a tour with visits to Madrid and the town of Baldojoz in Extremadura and of course our sister city of Alburquerque where we will celebrate the unveiling of New Mexico artist Frederico Vigil's fresco at City Hall. <u>Approximate</u> trip description follows:

Depart Monday, August 8, 2016 to Madrid. Arrive in Madrid Tuesday, August 9.

Madrid highlights inbound (2 days/2 nights): Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofia to see Picasso's "Guernica." Tour of the Museo Nacional del Prado, one of the greatest art museums in the world and one of the most visited.

Days 3, 4, 5 August 11, 12, 13 Thursday -Sunday Alburquerque

Arrive in Alburquerque and invitation to participate in the unveiling ceremony of Mr. Frederico Vigil's fresco painted in the City Hall. The Historic International Fresco Sister City Project will be dedicated around 8 p.m. The Fresco (462 sq ft) is located inside the Ayuntamiento in the Beautiful "Salin De Plenos".

Alburquerque, formerly known as Albacuercus in 590 A.C., has been declared one of Spain's Historic and Artistic Pueblos. Located in the Province of Badajoz, Extremadura, Alburquerque has been inhabited by the Arabs, Celtics, Romans and Visagoths. It has also been conquered by the Portuguese and many speak the ancient language of Castio. The Castillo De Luna (13th century) is one of Spain's most famous Medieval castles and was declared a National Monument in 1924. Inside the Barrio Medieval, you will go back in time as you visit the 'Barrio Gotico-Judio' or 'Villa Adentro.'

In 1984, The Festival Medieval was developed to celebrate the Three Cultures; Judia, Cristiano, Islámica and in 2002, received the Internacional Prize "Mundo Teatro" as one of the best "Teatro Amateur De La Union Europea and in 2004, declared "Fiesta De Interes Tuŕistico Regional".

Alburquerque to Madrid Sunday, August 14. At this point in the trip, some people have expressed an interest in traveling to Portugal, some to Seville and some to return to Madrid for the return trip home. Subject to change based on interest: The cost of the trip is still being developed, but expect to pay around \$3,500 double occupancy, \$4,000 single, inclusive of airfare, ground transportation in Spain, hotels, several meals, and some venue entrance fees.
