Sister Cities visit from Zambia:

On January 6 three Zambians—Andrew Chapuma, Lloyd Mwansa, and Haggai Musonda-- arrived at the Albuquerque International Airport and were greeted by Albuquerque Sister Cities Foundation (ASCF) president Pam Feather, ASCF member John Feather, and Richard Buckler. The delegation came on the invitation of Western University in Silver City, through a scholarship agreement with King Chitimukulu, paramount chief of the Bemba people. The King sent his royal emissary, Andrew Chapuma, who has been to New Mexico several times previously, to accompany the two new students Lloyd and Haggai.

The first order of business: introducing Lloyd and Haggai to two staples of Albuquerque Students: Golden Pride chicken and Dion's pizza. After a brief overnight at the Buckler's home, Silver City was the destination. Upon arrival, the students were met by Andrew's daughter Natasha, herself a student at Western since 2018. Natasha skillfully navigated our two new students through the maze of Dormitory placement, supplies purchased, student I.D.s completed, and entry tests scheduled, and then after working a two-hour shift at her oncampus job, was able to spend the first time in four years with her father.

Andrew has been tasked by his King to revitalize the connections between Zambia and New Mexico, negotiated verbally when the King himself had last been in New Mexico in 2018, and for which follow-up was put on hold because of the Covid Pandemic. To that end Andrew has had many meetings with non-profits, government officials, and Sister Cities committees, including our ASCF Lusaka Committee

headed up by Dr. Harold Bailey, Chair. Dr. Bailey has been very supportive of the student program established between Western University and Zambia, but has suggested that a "next step" might be to invite Zambian Businesses to come to New Mexico in the upcoming year(s) to participate in an Economic Forum. He and Andrew believe that Zambia has much to offer New Mexico, and thus want to encourage further connections not only with private citizens but also with New Mexico Chambers, Businesses, Investors, and Public Officials.



One of the major concerns for Andrew and King Chitimukulu is the lack of computers for the youth in many parts of Zambia, including the Bemba Kingdom. Part of the problem is connectivity to the internet, but more often the students have no computers either. Thus, Andrew has prolonged his stay to March 1 to share his vision to raise up "Youth with A Mission." To this end Andrew has spoken to various schools, first to encourage students to be "email-pals", and secondarily to raise the awareness for New Mexico to reach out to their sister cities in Zambia. In 2022, the Albuquerque Sister Cities Foundation had the honor of facilitating a program of exchange focused on #STEAM youth engagement and education. We're proud to have partnered with Agnes Chavez, Founder of STEMArts Lab, to bring Space Messengers to our Sister City Guadalajara!

Space Messengers is an immersive and educational installation created in collaboration with artists, scientists, philosophers, Students trying out Space Messengers cultural specialists, and youth leaders from around the world.

This installation was the capstone project for the students from the disadvantaged schools in Guadalajara and New Mexico that participated in the virtual 7-week workshop. Students were able to learn about the universe from science experts in the fields of particle physics, astrophysics, and space science. Agnes presented Space Messengers during Guadalajara's International Book Fair and exhibited the breathtaking installation at the Lunaria Planetarium as part of "Noche de las Estrellas", a nationwide astronomy event in Mexico with more than 90 hubs.

Fire Equipment Donated by The City of Rio Communities from The US State of New Mexico to Antigua and Barbuda!

The City of Rio Communities and Albuquerque in the U.S State of New Mexico have officially approved the donation of Fire Equipment to Antigua and Barbuda. Ralph L. Mims, President of R. Mims World Group became aware of the need to strengthen Antigua and Barbuda's fire fighting capabilities after consulting with First Secretary Roderick Faustin from the Embassy of Antigua and Barbuda in Washington DC. This need was further confirmed by former Fire Chief Elvis Weaver. When Mr. Mims approached both cities, they agreed to donate the following fire equipment. The City of Rio Communities City donated: a 300 ft, 3 inch fire hose, 100ft, 1 3/4 inch fire hose, 100 ft, 5 inch hose. 6 bunker jackets and 1 pair of bunker bottoms. While the City of Albuquerque donated: 12 pairs of wildland boots, 1Typhoon PPV fan, 50 sets of OOS bunker boots, 20 pairs of OOS bunker boots, 6 sections of OOS 1-3/4 hose and 2 metal booster hose reels (without the hose). The Albuquerque donation is scheduled to arrive in Antigua in late March 2023 and the City of Rio Communities donation's estimated arrival time is July 2023. Both cities envision a long term humanitarian connection with Antigua and Barbuda.
